Clubhouse Planning application

Amazing News – I am delighted to tell you that I was advised today that we have gained planning permission for our long awaited clubhouse. I hope it will take less time than that to complete the project, and be able to sit down in our clubhouse and have a drink!

We now have to look at the finances and how we will raise the necessary funds. As you may be aware we reported at the AGM that we had £41,568 in our clubhouse fund having spent nearly £5000 on the feasibility study, so we have good platform to work from towards our target of 100k.

This will be your clubhouse to make use of and benefit from, so we all need to take responsibility to come up with ideas and ways to raise the funding, so please put your thinking caps on!

A parent group meeting will be held shortly – (date to be confirmed) so that we can have a full and frank discussion on the way forward to achieve our clubhouse dream. If you would like to attend it, please get in touch with me.

AGM Report - Thursday 10th March 2022 by Zoom

- It was again very strange holding our second AGM online so a big THANKYOU to those of you who attended, and the good news is that we again got through the business in the 40 minutes allocated! I just hope that we do not have to repeat this next year!
- Reviewing the twelve months to 30th September, we recognised the issues that we had to work with covid restrictions
 and yet coped very well with the delivery of our coaching programme thanks primarily to Ben and Blake, not forgetting
 his assistants Kobe, Nia, Hattie and helpers. Off court we had made significant progress with the proposals for our

clubhouse and in June we submitted our feasibility study to Oswestry Town Council / Cae Glas Park Charity. I am pleased to advise that we gained approval in September and we are now working with Gavin Porritt – DPA Ltd to complete a planning application.

- For those interested in our finances, our accounts for 2020/21 show a surplus of £3,168 which was credited to boost our general reserve to £6142, our resurfacing fund now stands at £4,307, and our clubhouse fund now stands at £41,568.
- Our parent working group was re-elected en bloc, Paula Jones took over the reins from Emma Spelman as our Club welfare officer last summer and was re-elected, whilst Helen Shiel was reappointed as Treasurer. Many thanks go to Emma/ Paula and Helen for all their work through this very difficult year. I was re-elected Deputy Treasurer and Chairman for my fifth year in this position, and will again try to do my best for you. Mark Lord was reappointed as our auditor. You will also be pleased to know that there was a motion to allow an individual's age to be a trustee to be increased from 75 to 80 especially to accommodate me!
- Finally if anyone reading this would be interested in joining our parent working group, please let me know there's always room for more!

Coaching Programme

I would like to start by thanking everyone who kept us going through the winter, it is not an easy time of year but you all kept bringing smiles to the courts.

We are now into the spring and the days are lengthening out quicker than Blake's serve, so this is prime time to get out and play more tennis. Courts are free from 1pm on Saturdays and all day Sundays, as well as various times in the week, please check our website to see what the court schedule is, so you can find a time to come down and play some tennis.

Competitions:

On Saturday 7th May from 1pm-3pm, we will be hosting a mini red, orange and green ball competition. This is a fun event and the children will play some fun matches against each other, with the help of some young assistants umpiring their matches. This is a time to put into practice little things they have learnt in their sessions and most importantly have fun.

Along with the mini tennis event on the 7th, we will be running a Road to Wimbledon competition for U14's. This is a yearly event run nationally and all those who are eligible have been sent an email about this event and we encourage all of you to have a go and enjoy a day of fun matches.

Open Day:

On Saturday 21st May from 1pm-3pm, OTT will be hosting a free open day for public members to come and have a go at some tennis. This day will be about promoting our club and the junior tennis activities we have going on, all members are welcome to come down and join in the fun activities and if you know anyone who would like to come down, please invite them. We want to fill our courts up and see loads of tennis going on throughout the afternoon.

Extra sessions:

There are plenty of ways to get an extra bit of tennis in a week and having those extra sessions is a great way of improving and taking your tennis to the next level. Just give us a message or talk to us at the courts and we can arrange a private lesson or if you would like to share a lesson with a friend or someone in your group and split the cost, we can arrange this also.
