Clubhouse update

Progress with finalising our 25 years Heads of Term agreement which enables us to apply for serious external funding has been slow but we are getting there soon! Many thanks go to Gavin Porritt and DPA Ltd for their continued support in moving the project development forwards. We continue to provide fundraising opportunities to increase our Clubhouse Fund this summer, and below are our latest fundraising efforts. I anticipate that we will have raised a fantastic additional £9,000 by the end of September which is our year end for accounting purposes to reach £56,000, less professional expenses of 4k to date. We obviously need to keep this momentum going throughout 2023/24 **so please think about what you can do to help us on the way!**

Well, I completed my 12 day walk over 172 miles with the last two days starting early at 6am to avoid the heat and humidity. Day One, I walked from Poachers near Chirk via Offa's Dyke and on to Llanymynech around 20 miles for just over 10 hours with more ups and downs than across in hot and humid conditions which were less than ideal! Day 2 started well with Mike McKenna – Parish Paths Partnership joining me at the tennis club at 6am to walk 13 miles of Oswalds trail with the intention of arriving at our own "Wimbledon tournament" around 3pm, but given that the tournament had to be cancelled and we sadly had to abandon at Brogyntyn Lodge with the rain hammering down accompanied with thunder and lightning.
